# 4-H Demonstration or Illustrated Talk Outline Planning Form

Subject Matter or Topic:	
Short Title:	
Introduction (10%) is an attention grabber. Ask a question, show a unique object or make a challenging statement, tell a short story or show a finished product.	
Body (80%) includes the most important information. Follow the steps below:  A. Do:	
List step or procedure #1.	
List step or procedure #2.	
List step or procedure #3.	
List step or procedure #4.	
List step or procedure #5.	
B. Say:	
One, two or three sentences for step #1.	
One, two or three sentences for step #2.	
One, two or three sentences for step #3.

One, two or three sentences for step #4	
One, two or three sentences for step #5.	

C. Equipment and Visuals:
List equipment/visuals needed to do step #1
List equipment/visuals needed to do step #2
List equipment/visuals needed to do step #3
List equipment/visuals needed to do step #4.
List equipment/visuals needed to do step #5.
D. Why:
Tell why you did step 1 this way.
Tell why you did step 2 this way.
Tell why you did step 3 this way.
Tell why you did step 4 this way.
Tell why you did step 5 this way.
Follow this same procedure until you have completed the body of the demonstration or illustrated talk. The number of items listed depends on the type and length of presentation.
Summary/Conclusion (10%) quickly recaps the main points of the presentation.
