The 4-H Core Values

The 4-H Cloverbuds program is part of the overall Kansas 4-H program, even though it has different policies and activities than the 4-H club program focused for the 7- to 19-year-olds. 4-H Cloverbuds is about meeting the developmental needs of its participants. Even so, the 4-H Cloverbuds still embrace the 4-H core values. These core values are:

4-H Colors: White symbolizes purity. Green, which is nature's most common color, represents life, springtime, and youth.

4-H Emblem: The green four-leaf clover has a white H on each leaf to represent the four H's: Head, Heart, Hands, and Health. The 4-H name and emblem are protected under federal status Title 18, and U.S. Code 707.

Who May Participate

4-H Cloverbuds is an educational youth development opportunity for 5- and 6-year-old children. To be eligible to participate, a child must have celebrated his or her 5th or 6th birthday before January 1 of the current year.

When a child reaches the age of eligibility for traditional 4-H programs (age 7 or older), the child and his or her parent(s) or guardian(s) can decide whether to transition into 4-H club membership. 4-H Cloverbuds is an age-appropriate educational opportunity; a 4-H Cloverbud cannot be a 4-H club member at the same time.
